Applying for a Secondary School place for September 2020

If your child is due to start secondary school in September 2020, then you will need to complete an application using the online application system available on the Oldham Council website. It's quick and easy and ensures school offers can be made efficiently via e-mail. Applying on line is the only form of application as Oldham Council no longer provides paper application forms.

The online system will open on 1 August 2019 and close at 5pm on 31 October 2019.

If you don't have access to the internet, there are computers in all Oldham's libraries. You will need an email address, these are very easy to set up and staff will be happy to help.

Some voluntary aided schools may want you to fill in a supplementary form or provide documentation in addition to the application you make to us. Supplementary forms are available from and returned to the relevant school.

To enable you to have a look at what is on offer, all Oldham secondary schools will be holding open evenings during the autumn term. You will be able to access further information, a guide and links to school websites by logging onto www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions

The closing date for all applications is **5pm 31 October 2019.** Any application received after this time will be classed as late and will not be processed until all the on time applications have been allocated a school place.

The last day of Pompeii.

In 79AD, the 24th of August began like any other day for the people of Pompeii; but they didn't know what was waiting for them.

At 8am, it was normal and peaceful in the city of Pompeii. People were getting along, the sweet scent of bread filled the air and everything was fine. Then the ground started to shake but the people of Pompeii were used to it because Vesuvius was always causing tremors and mini earthquakes so they were still doing their thing.

Later on in the afternoon, it got a little bit more serious. The ground shook and was rumbling and roof tiles were falling. It made such noise babies cried and animals were mooing, barking, chirping or whatever sound they made.

Near 3pm, pumice and ash covered all the buildings, suffocating a few people. It was a complete disaster. The trees were burnt and the gods' temple was breaking apart. Before, the sky was a clear blue but now, it was almost covered with grey ash and pumice.

Before long, at 5pm, fire and lightning struck the city. People were screaming, some dying and others hiding. People were crying and animals were shouting. There was thunder and the volcano was covered in blackness, and smoke and ash was everywhere.

At sunset, around 8pm, the town was still burning, roof tiles were shattered and smoke was rising everywhere. There were still some people alive but there was no one screaming. People were alive, but hurt.

Later that day, the town was covered in darkness and some parts glowed from the lava in the distance. Some buildings were still standing but broken. The city was nowhere near as beautiful as it was before.

At 6am, it was completely destroyed. It looked like a graveyard that had just been burnt. There were only tiny remains of the city. Then, the pyroclastic flow came. The whole city was swept away.
