

## Homework Menu

Select some of these tasks to complete whilst at home.  
You can also make up a new task of your own to share with the class when we return to school.

### English focus

Write a letter to an imaginary friend in a different country and tell them why living in Hathershaw is so great!  
Think about the park, the shops, our school, our houses etc.

### PSHE focus

Think about the people who work in and help look after their local community. Make a list of all the different people they can think of. Describe what each of these people do and explain why their work is so important.

### Maths focus

Find out which vehicles use the road or streets near to your house. Undertake a traffic survey, counting and tallying the numbers of cars, vans, trucks and any special vehicles such as ambulances, bin lorries and police cars, in a given period of time. Or look out of the window and count the cars on your street and make a graph.

### English focus

Interview someone who has lived in your community for a long time, perhaps an elderly relative or neighbour you know well. What changes have they seen? Which things are better or worse today? You could call them and interview them on the phone to find out these answers?

### Maths focus

### Creative focus
