

Deadly Dinosaurs

With a family member, make up a 'Dinosaur Alphabet'. Make a list naming at least one dinosaur for each letter of the alphabet. You may need to invent some new names!

Choose a dinosaur and create a mini fact file, book or poster with interesting facts that you found out.

What is its name?
What does the name mean?
Describe what it looks like.
What does it eat?
Where did it live?
How big was it?
How heavy was it?
Did it have any enemies?
Which period of time did it exist in?

Look carefully at pictures of different dinosaurs. Have a go at sketching a dinosaur. Try to include the detail of the scaly skin and sharp, pointy teeth.

Log on to Purple Mash and use 2create to design your own dinosaur. Use the scaly felt tips to add detail and texture. Can you label it and write captions to describe its features?

Use internet search engines, video clips and non-fiction books, to learn about the time that dinosaurs existed. When did the Triassic period begin? When did dinosaurs become extinct? With help from a family member, create a dinosaur timeline. Try CBB's Dinosaur fact pages, they are full of video clips and fun activities.

Can you make up a dinosaur song or rap? Perform it to your family or record a video and ask an adult to email it to us!

Use an internet search engine, or non-fiction books, to research the diets of different dinosaurs. Create a list of foods that herbivore dinosaurs ate. What did carnivore dinosaurs eat? Use this knowledge to design a 'Dinosaur Menu' which a dinosaur could choose from if it were alive today.

Research what the habitat of a dinosaur was like and then, with some help from a family member, create a 'dinosaur environment'. You could use boxes, stones, twigs, leaves, dinosaur figures and pictures. Alternatively, if you have LEGO, use that to build a 'dinosaur environment'.

Watch videos of dinosaurs to find out what they were like. What did they sound like? How did they move around? Now use your voice and body to show the movements and noises that dinosaurs made. How many different types of dinosaurs can you act like? Challenge your family to guess the names.
