

Commas

Commas can have a number of roles in a sentence:

- To separate items in a list
- With speech punctuation
- To mark clauses
- To clarify meaning





Commas for clarity

Commas play an important role in helping the reader understand what the writer is trying to say.

Look at these examples:

He sprang to his feet quickly, realising that someone was at the door.

He sprang to his feet, quickly realising that someone was at the door.





Commas for clarity


He sprang to his feet quickly, realising that someone was at the door.

This sentence is saying that he was quick to get to his feet.



He sprang to his feet, quickly realising that someone was at the door.

This sentence is saying that he was quick to realise someone was at the door.






Commas for clarity

Look at the following sentences and add a comma to change their meaning:

Bill claims joe is the best bowler in the team.

We are going to learn to cut and stick kids.





How did you do?

Bill claims joe is the best bowler in the team. Bill, claims joe, is the best bowler in the team.

How have he commas changed the meaning?

At first Bill is saying Joe is the best bowler. Adding the comma has changed the sentence so that Joe is claiming Bill is the best bowler.

After leaving Sarah, Claire and Dave went to the cinema.
