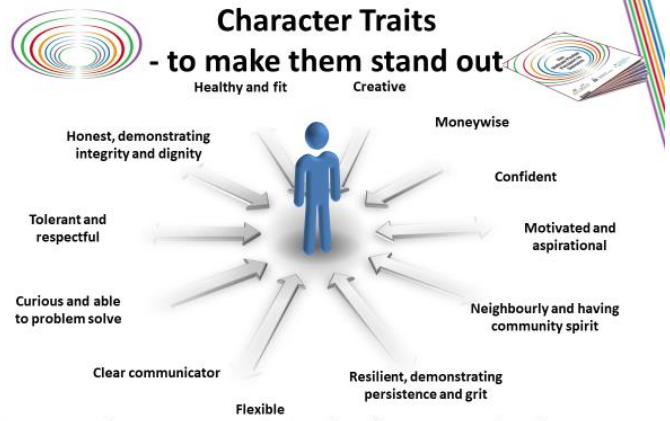
Unit 3 have done activities this year that counts towards Oldham Pledge. Here is a reminder of what Oldham Pledge is about....
