Pledge 7 To actively engage in an outward bound activity or residential.

Pledge 8 To take part in a presentation or performance to an audience.

Pledge 9 To attend sporting and creative events.

Pledge 10 To be involved in a volunteering or leadership role in or beyond your place of learning.

Pledge 11 To be involved in a cultural or international experience.

Pledge 12 Contribute to environmental sustainability.

Pledge 13 To be involved in a democratic process.
