


BC means 'before Christ'. Anything that happened before the year AD 1 is BC.

AD is an abbreviation of the Latin phrase: anno Domini which means 'in the year of the Lord'. Unless there could be some confusion, we usually leave out the AD when saying the year.



Sometimes people use BCE (Before Common Era) and CE (Common Era) instead of referencing Christianity.




It ended when the last Pharaoh, Cleopatra VII, committed suicide and Egypt became part of the Roman Empire in 30 BC.
