

### What is Egypt like?

#### Where is Egypt?

Egypt is a country in northern Africa and the Sinai
Peninsula of Egypt to the east of the country links Africa
with southwest Asia. It is situated next to Libya, Sudan
and Israel. The Mediterranean Sea lies on the north coast
and the Red Sea lies on the east coast.




#### How big is Egypt?

Egypt is around 675 miles (1085 km) from north to south and 780 miles (1255 km) from east to west. It has an area of 385,229 square miles (997,739 square km). It is the twelfth largest country in Africa.

#### How many people live in Egypt?

The population of Egypt is around 81 and a half million people. Most of the people who live in Egypt live in towns and cities near the River Nile. Towns developed here because the banks of the Nile provide the only land that is fertile, which means it is able to grow crops. The rest of Egypt (about 90%) is made up of desert. The population of Cairo is around 8 million people, while the second biggest city, Alexandria, is around 4 million.




#### What is the weather like in Egypt?

Egypt is one of the hottest and driest countries in the world. It has a mild winter from November to April and a hot summer from May to October. The average temperature in Egypt is 22°C but in July (which is the hottest month) temperatures usually reach around 37°C. Temperatures vary depending where in Egypt you are. At night in the desert, temperatures can reach freezing point. There is very little rainfall in Egypt but the wettest months are December to March.

#### What is Egypt famous for?

Egypt is famous for its history and the landmarks left by the ancient Egyptian civilisation, such as the pyramids and the sphinx. Egypt is also famous for its river, the Nile. The River Nile is the longest river in the world and runs for 4160 miles (6695 km).




