
Hansel and Gretel

Home Learning Challenges

Draw a picture of the cottage of sweets in the middle of the forest. Think carefully about the different sweets that could be used for the roof, the windows, the door and the path. Add your favourite sweets to the picture. Think about a range of different materials you could use to complete the picture. You could use crayons, felt-tip pens, paint or collage materials.





In some versions of the story, Hansel and Gretel dropped crumbs or pebbles on the ground to help them find their way home. Can you draw a map of your journey from home to a special place? It could be your nursery or preschool, a friend's house or the park.

Tell the story of Hansel and Gretel to somebody. You could use a book you have or use the Internet. See if you can remember the different parts of the story in the correct order. As it is a traditional tale, there are lots of different versions, so you can't get it wrong – it will be your own version!

Build a house using junksweets or use modelling materials and make it look like sweets. Think about how you can attach the different sweets to each other, how you can make them balance and whether the house can stand without support.
