



Remember: Save the apostrophe for when you want to show possession (something that belongs to something or someone)

For example Miss Welby's smelly socks need a wash.

Don't add an apostrophe every time a word ends in 's'.

The flower's are pretty. *

This doesn't need an apostrophe as it isn't showing that that the flowers own anything.

The flowers are pretty. <
