
Year 3 and 4 Home Learning Art (Egyptian) Week 7 Friday


Last time we did Egyptian Art, you might have made some papyrus paper. You could use it in this lesson (if you still have it). If not, plain paper will be fine.


Today we will look at the Ancient Egyptian Creation Story. You can choose parts of the story to draw. You could draw one part or draw a few. OR draw the main parts of the story!


Remember, pictures of humans, Gods or Godesses are drawn side on. They also used hieroglyphics because they were telling stories.


























Nut produced rain for Geb, and the rain fell onto the Earth. Everything on the Earth began to grow.


