Wednesday - Writing

Yesterday you wrote the beginning of your newspaper article. Today you are going to do your edited version.

Ask an adult or an older member of your family to read what you wrote yesterday. Talk to each other about whether someone would want to read your writing. Does it entice the reader.

Have look whether you have achieved the SC (Success Criteria). Can you edit your writing anywhere? If so, change it in your book.

SC

1. Capital letters and full stops in appropriate places.
2. Other punctuation eg ? ! , () -
3. CAPITAL LETTERS FOR NEWSPAPER TITLE, DATE, HEADING AND SUBHEADINGS.
4. Handwriting that is consistent in size (tall letters standing tall, tail letters with the tail hanging below the line). Joined if you can.

1. Started work in the Valley of the Kings, Egypt because lots of tombs had been found there already.
2. It took years to make the first significant discovery. They found the top of a set of stairs. They began to uncover it.
3. On 26th November 1922, they were ready to look through the wall at the base of the stairs. This wall led to the golden antechamber (a set of rooms that are linked together by corridors). They wouldn't know at the time whose tomb it was. They discovered this later...
