

**LO: To understand the function of money (bronze).**

- 1) Miss Mitchell bought 3 bags of sweets to fill up her sweetie tin!  
Each bag cost £2.30.

How much did Miss Mitchell spend on sweets?

- 2) A child's ticket to the cinema costs £5.60, whilst an adults costs £8.55.  
How much more does an adult ticket cost?

- 3) Hannah went shopping with £10.17, and bought some  
sunglasses for £7.89.

How much money did she have left?

- 4) Imagine we had never developed money... what would you use to buy these  
5 things: a haircut; a bag of crisps; a new pair of trainers; a pencil case;  
and a new PS4 game. Remember to write your answers in full sentences.

### Challenge

- 3) Hannah went shopping with £15.10, and bought some sunglasses for £9.80, and flip flops for £2.45.  
How much money did she have left?
  
- 4) Do you think we should keep the penny coin? Create a table listing the reasons to keep the penny, and reasons not to keep the penny. Make your conclusion at the end.

4) Write a short paragraph describing what you think the world would be like if, in the future, all physical bank notes and coins disappeared and all payments were contactless.
