### **Internet Safety**

The impact of COVID-19 has meant that all of our learning is now on our Broadfield website. This means that our children are spending more time online. Online learning delivers huge benefits and gives us the opportunity to stay connected to family and friends during this period. However, it is really important that as far as possible, you try to keep your child safe on line.

Parental controls help you to block or filter upsetting or inappropriate content, and control purchases within apps. You can install parental control software on your child's and family's phones or tablets, games consoles, laptops and your home internet.

Parental controls can help you to:

- o plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for
- o create content filters to block apps that may have inappropriate content
- o manage the content different family members can see.

Home internet providers can offer parental controls for your child. You can:

- use a filter from your internet provider to control the content that you and your family see.
- set up any device connected to your home broadband. How you do this depends on your provider and you'll need to access your home router. For support call our experts from the O2 NSPCC Advice Line on <u>0808 800 5002</u>.
- make sure your child uses the internet through WiFi instead of through 3G, 4G or 5G.
  Otherwise parental controls won't work.
