Approximately - Almost, but not completely, accurate or exact

Two ways of measuring distance include miles or kilometres.

The speed signs in different countries may be in miles or kilometres depending on which measurement they decide to use.



What does this sign mean?




The sign stands for approximately as sometimes when we are converting, we may used a rounded approach rather than multiple decimal places.

For example:






If 5 miles is approximately 8 kilometres, what would the following miles be in kilometres?
