Your child is learning how vowels, (a, e, i, o, u) can make different sounds. For example 'i' can have a short vowel sound ('i' as in 'pip) or a long vowel sound ('i' as in 'pipe'). - Point out how the long 'i' sounds are made in each list.
- Try to think of other words that rhyme, follow the same rule or pattern.
- Discuss the meaning of the words and try to think of a sentence containing the word.
