What's the difference between Islam and Muslim?

Islam is based on the five pillars:



SHAHADAH

Shahadah means a Muslim must declare there is only one God and that is Allah. They also trust that Muhammad is God's messenger.

Muslims make this declaration by reciting these words in Arabic.





Salat is the Islamic Prayer and consists of five prayers. Each prayer is recited in a position that faces Mecca. Muslims prefer to pray in a mosque. They perform a series of set positions five times a day.

- Before sunrise
- Midday
- Evening prayer before sunset
- Evening prayer after sunset
- Night Prayer



Muslims like to help people who don't get paid much money. One of the requirements is to give money to the poor and needy. Zakat means to be charitable and give to those in need.

Muslims give at least 2.5% of whatever money they make to

SAWM

Muslims fast for a month. This is called Ramadan. During this time Muslims don't eat or drink from dawn until dusk. When the sun goes down they will eat a feast with their family. Fasting allows Muslims to seek forgiveness from God and be aware of

people in need.










HAJJ

The Hajj is a pilgrimage, which is a religious journey. Muslims are required to go on the Hajj once in their life. The Hajj is a journey to a town called Mecca where Muslims gather together and perform group prayers. The Hajj is a devotion to God and after the journey Muslims are well-respected in their community.

<u>Zakat</u>

Zakat is the third pillar and means to give money to the needy. Muslims are required to give 2.5% of their yearly income to the poor and needy people. This helps Muslims free themselves from greed and the love of money.

<u>Sawm</u>

Sawm is the fourth pillar of Islam and means fasting. Muslims fast for one month of the year. They give up food and drink in the daylight hours and feast when the sun goes down. Fasting teaches Muslims to appreciated God and learn self-discipline.


Hajj
