If you do not have access to the internet at home, please contact the school office and we will provide you with a pack.

Thank you for supporting us in ensuring your child can continue to learn from home.


Learning in the Nursery

Well done to Hashim and Amelia, who have been learning to recognise their numbers at home with the support of their mum. Please keep it up.




Happy Birthday

The Magic Paintbrush


