90%, 10%, 0%, 6%

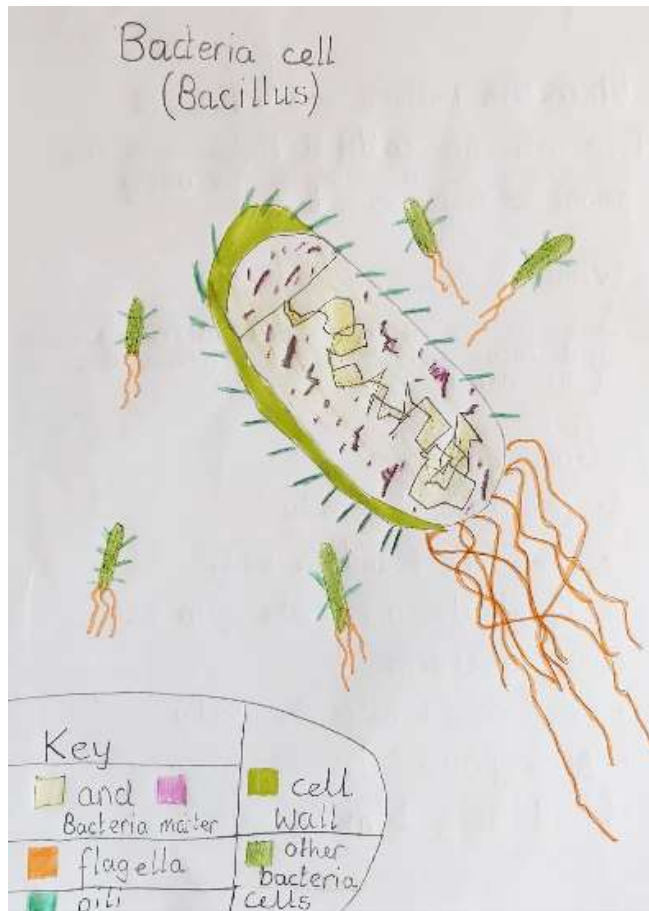
Answer: 90%
