



School reopening

Dear Parents/Carers,

First of all, I want to thank everybody for their continued support whether your child has been learning from school or at home. I know that it has been a challenging time for everyone and it is brilliant that we are able to welcome all children back to school on **Monday 8th March**.

Attendance

From 8th March, school attendance will be mandatory and our usual rules on attendance will apply.

As a reminder, your child should self-isolate and not come to school if they:

- Have coronavirus symptoms or have tested positive
- Live with someone who has symptoms or have tested positive
- Are a close contact of someone who has tested positive

Our safety measures

Rest assured that we're doing everything we can to make sure our pupils can return to school safely. We'll be taking the following protective measures to keep everyone safe:

- Staggered start times
- Children should be dropped off by one parent/carer only
- Adults should social distance when collecting children and when you have collected your child, please leave the school grounds as soon as possible
- Cleaning more frequently to get rid of the virus on frequently touched surfaces such as table tops, door handles, toys and play equipment.
- Regular hand washing for 20 seconds with running water and soap or the use of sanitiser and ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the catch it, bin it, kill it approach.

Step 5: Be careful not to put water in his ears because if you try to say something he won't be able to hear you.


Step 6: Be prepared Woolly Mammoths love to play in the water.
