The academic Year Sept 2020 to July 2021 was severely disrupted due to COVID 19. Broadfield provided excellent remote learning for pupils during this time and vulnerable pupils continued to attend school. National test were cancelled and it is widely acknowledged that progress and attainment will have been affected. Data provided is Summer 2019 which is the latest validated data.
