#### **Reception 2022**

If your child is due to start Reception in September 2022, it is important that you complete the online application at <a href="www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions">www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions</a>. You can only apply online - It's quick and easy and means you get the school offer directly via email. Even if you have a child already at the school of your choice you still need to apply now. The online system opened on 1 September 2021.

#### When do I need to complete my application?

The closing date for all applications was 15 January 2022 at 5pm.

#### What happens if I don't complete my application on time?

This means you may not get a place at your preferred school. Your application won't be looked at until after we've allocated places to all those that arrived on time. If you have missed the closing date, please still complete your application form online as soon as possible




#### Off with their heads!

This half term, the children in Upper Key Stage 2 are learning about the Tudors. How much do you know about the different types of punishments during Tudor times?


#### The Pillory

They would then have to stand in this device in the town centre whilst a passer-by and members of society would ridicule them.
