Applying for a Reception Place in September 2023

If your child is in Nursery, they will be due to start Reception in September 2023.

You will need to complete an application using the online application system available on the Oldham Council website.

The online system opened on 1 September 2022 and will close at 5pm on 15 January 2023.

We recommend that a **minimum** of three preferences are made for any application.

If you don't have access to the internet, there are computers in all Oldham's libraries and at the Civic Centre – Access Oldham.

You will be able to access further information, a guide, and links to school websites by logging onto <u>www.oldham.gov.uk/admissions</u>

If you are unsure about this process, please contact school and a member of the office staff will be more than happy to help.

Even if you already have a child or children at Broadfield, you still need to apply for a school place.
