How much do you know about Early Islam, Baghdad and the Silk Road. Stephen from Sycamore carried out his own research and created the presentation below.



# Early Islamic Civilisation

A caliph was the Islamic state's supreme religious and political leader. He was considered the spiritual leader of the entire Muslim population in the world. The caliph was often referred to as the Amir al-Mu'minin, or "Commander of the Believers."

- The origins of the city Baghdad
- The House of Wisdom
- A Significant achievement of an early Islamic scholar
- The Silk Road and trade

The city was founded in 762 as the capital of the Abbasid dynasty of caliphs, and for the next 500 years it was the most significant cultural centre of Arab and Islamic civilizations and one of the greatest cities of the world. It was conquered by the Mongol leader Hülegü in 1258, after which its importance waned.

The House of Wisdom included a society of scientists and academics, a translation department and a library that preserved the knowledge acquired by the Abbasids over the centuries. They also researched and studied alchemy, which was later used to create the structure of modern chemistry.

What did Islam trade on the silk road?

Spread of Islam along the Silk Road

Textiles, gems, spices, animals and even religions were all exchanged along this vast expanse, starting around 1,000 B.C. and continuing for millennia.


Some of the significant achievements of early Muslim philosophers included the development of a strict science of citation, the isnad or "backing"; the development of a method of open inquiry to disprove claims, the ijtihad, which could be generally applied to many types of questions.
